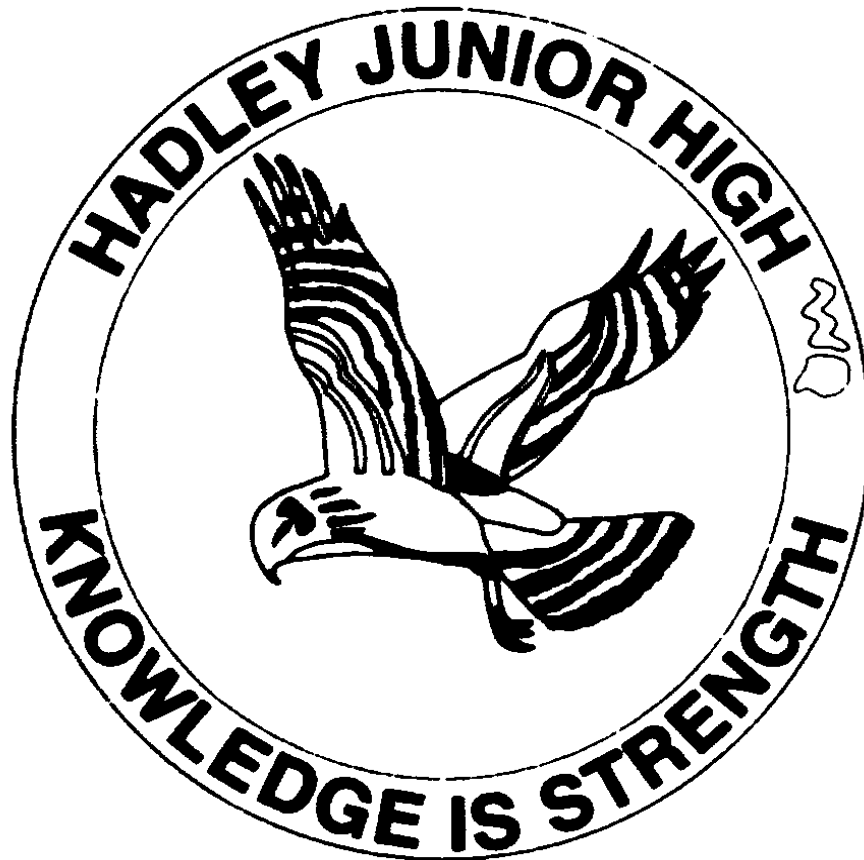

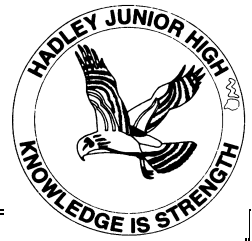

## Arts Option Course Descriptions

### ART

The Visual Arts program is based on the following two competencies that are evaluated at the end of each term;

- Creates personal and media images
- Appreciates works of art and cultural objects from the world's artistic heritage, personal images and media images.

This course will give students the opportunity to experience different art mediums such as oil/chalk pastels, acrylic/tempura/watercolour paints, charcoal/conté chalk, and printmaking/black ink. When producing their own work, students will develop skills and techniques in drawing, painting, printmaking, and sculpting 3 dimensional forms.

Students will learn concepts and vocabulary that will allow them to appreciate known works of art, as well as those of their own and their classmates.

*\*Please note that there is a course fee of 12\$ for each student who is enrolled in the Art course that is added to the student's annual school fees.*

### MUSIC

In music, you perform and write music, learn theory, history and music technology. You will continue to learn to play a wind or percussion instrument, and learn instrument assembly, care and use, posture, theory to help read music, breathing, and articulation. You will continue to learn about types of music, study composers, bands and musicians, listen to excerpts of musical works from different cultures and periods in history, and by your classmates. You will improve your listening skills and vocabulary when describing and critiquing music. You will write your own rhythms and melodies using voice, body, sound objects, percussion instruments and wind instruments, and you will expand your use of music technology to write, record and process your music. Most importantly, you will broaden your understanding of music, and strengthen your communication and teamwork skills. The secondary music program is designed help you develop in the three required competencies:

- Creates musical works
- Performs musical works
- Appreciates musical works

*\*Please note that there is a course fee of 15\$ for each student who is enrolled in the Music course that is added to the student's annual school fees.*

### Drama

Grade 8 Drama is a continuation of the Grade 7 Drama program. The students are introduced to different improvisation structures and to Performance Drama. Although also grounded in the Developmental paradigm, the activities and games are designed to empower the students in their acting choices and to prepare them for the performance requirements of senior high school. The students will be developing the following complementary and interdependent competencies:

- To invent and interpret short scenes
- To appreciate dramatic works

*\*Please note that there is a course fee of 8\$ for each student who is enrolled in the Drama course that is added to the student's annual school fees.*



## Information for Parents/Guardians and Students: Modified Academic Program (MAP)

### Who is a candidate for the Modified Academic Program?

- Students who are working at their own individual instructional level based on their Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- Elementary school has recommended a modified placement, which means that students are working below grade level in English, Math and French and would benefit from a smaller class size and a more individualized program

### What are the benefits of the MAP Program?

Many students benefit from a more hands-on, concrete teaching approach. In the MAP program, your child will benefit from being in a small, enclosed class with fewer teachers. In this way, their individual learning needs are much better addressed. Individual progress is tracked and reported on frequently to allow students to reach their full potential in a comfortable learning environment.

### Details of the MAP Program:

The MAP Program is a three year program which allows students further time to progress within the junior high school prior to entering into senior high school. For the three years in MAP, your child will follow the same subjects as those students in the regular program. The difference is that your child will progress at their pace and their program will be individualized. Students will be assessed in English, Math, French, Science, History, Ethics, Art, Work Skills and Physical Education based on the levels indicated on their IEP.

### Program Structure:

- 3- year program based on age:
  - 12yrs = MAP year 1
  - 13yrs = MAP year 2
  - 14yrs= MAP year 3
- Leading to the Work Oriented Training Pathway (W.O.T.P.) at Philemon Wright.
- Upon successful completion of the W.O.T.P program, students receive a certificate indicating they have met the requirements of the program.
