## 2. Standing Committees

## 2.1 Parent Committee

- We spoke about the importance of Destination Imagination. The Parent Committee will
  do everything in their power to make this a yearly event.

- On March 9th, the Special Education Advisory Committee along with Connexions held a
  workshop on "Empowerment Through Mindfulness". The workshop was well attended. As

#### 3. New Business

## 3.1 Presentation: "Keep It Private" Cst. Joel Larente, Gatineau Police Liaison

- The Gatineau Police, Crown Attorneys Office and Centre for Victims or Sexual Assault
  will be launching an awareness campaign for youth on March 21, 2017. It is an education
  campaign addressing child pornography and a new article in the criminal code
  "distribution of private images". Cst. Larente will be coming to the school to address
  Grade 7 students (boys and girls separately).
- Grade 7 is the best age to help engage inforcement. Spliting by gender helps them to open up more honestly.
- The Center will address 'What is assault?". The police talk about the criminal code and reinforce that sending nude pictures is part of the criminal code and is child pornography.
- There are seven activities that are held in the school and community.
- Tools for parents PDF to creat discussion with your child. Not translated yet, but it will be in then next week or two. Campaign will also include PSAs in theatres this summer.

## 3.2. Band trip to Banff, AB - April 2018; teacher T. Ausman

 Currently the band goes to Sherbrooke, QC, each spring to compete against other high schools. This year there is an engaged parents group and they are willing to fundraise for the band group to travel to Banff AB., to attend Banff Music Retreats – clinicians and guest conductors as well as the great outdoors of the area.

- Ms .Ausman and Mr.Rusu are proposing dates in April 2018; a weekend with a PD day so that hopefully only 1 day of school will be missed. For ex. Wednesday to Sunday.
- Band parents were polled on interest and overwhelming majority of support was given.
- Approx. \$90 per person/night for food and lodging + airfair, clinicians and activites. Price will be approx \$1000/student.
- Minimum of 10 required. Teacher Chaperones (similar cost structure).

# 3.3 Destination Imagination trip May 23-28, 2017; teacher K. Piercey

- It is an international event with apporx 20,000 participants.
- The Hadley team (2 teachers, 6 students) won the opportunity to go to Global Finals to be held in Knoxville, Tennesse May 23-28, 2017
- WQSB is paying \$10,000 of the cost, the remainder needs to be Fundraised.
- \$750 per person registration fee (food, lodging, activities, shuttle buses).
- Transportation will need to be covered approx \$750 for travel, plus an amount for equipment.
- Need to fundraise \$8000.

# 3.4 – Day trip to Montreal's Gay Village May 5, 2017; Rainbow Alliance Group presented on their behalf by Dodie Payne
